

ANZTS SCHOLARSHIP

AIMS

To provide an opportunity for an interested medical, nursing, allied health or paramedical clinician to gain information and knowledge in current trauma care and delivery of clinical care in trauma systems in a targeted area of interest.

To promote quality trauma clinical care by providing exposure to trauma care in organisations outside of their usual place of practice.

To further the development of the care of injured patients through dedicated projects, knowledge, research and education in trauma management.

AVAILABILITY

Each year, the Australia & New Zealand Trauma Society Executive Committee will discuss and make recommendations regarding the availability of scholarship funds.

The Scholarship will be advertised within the usual ANZTS channels alongside promotion and advertisement at annual conferences. Details can also be found on the ANZTS website. Further details and important dates for applicants will be circulated with any calls for submissions.

Scholarship funds will be allocated by the ANZTS based on the availability of Society financial resources, the number and significance of scholarship applications and their rationale and feasibility. Up to four scholarships may be offered in each funding round. The maximum amount for any one scholarship will be \$5,000 (23/24FY). The amount awarded must cover only budgeted expenses directly incurred in the conduct of the approved activity and will require reconciliation with receipts at the completion of the scholarship period. No portion of the scholarship funds are to be used for personal income.

Decision of the selection panel is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- i. **Financial member of Australian & New Zealand Trauma Society at the time of the application**
- ii. **The applicants length of membership of ANZTS will be considered during the application review process and will factor into the final decision for the scholarship**

APPLICATION

1. A detailed description including
 - a. Summary and overview of the scholarship aims (100 words)
 - b. Objectives and expected outcomes of the scholarship, including (for example) any publications, lectures, guidelines or educational courses you expect to result from the activity.
 - c. A detailed description of the proposed 12 month scholarship program timeline which includes: facilities you may visit; projects you will undertake; courses you may participate in; what you hope to experience; who you will meet with; clinical or research work you plan to undertake; areas of clinical need you wish to focus on and any other relevant information
2. A detailed budget and expenses (inc any course fees, project costs, flights, accommodation, food, equipment, ground travel, miscellaneous etc.) including total funds requested and any previous funds accessed for this project
3. Current CV
4. **Two referees (including contact details) who must provide a supporting statement (500 words max) as to how this project will contribute to the applicants professional development and the improvement of trauma care.**

OBLIGATIONS OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Recipients would be expected to complete their scholarship within 12 months of award.

A short abstract (1000 words) detailing the experience and outcomes will be required within 2 weeks of completion for publication in the Australia & New Zealand Trauma Society publication (Trauma Talk)

A final report must be completed (based on standard proforma) and submitted within 3 months of the scheduled completion date to the ANZTS. Any applications for extensions to completion date must be submitted in writing to the ANZTS.

A detailed presentation based on the final report will be scheduled at a nominated ANZTS Conference.
